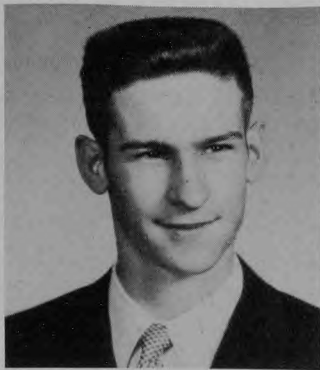

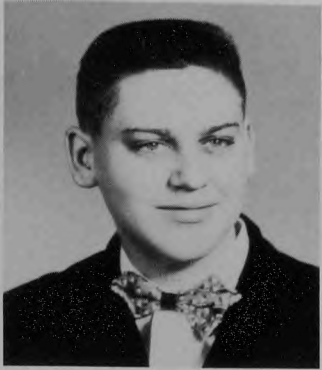

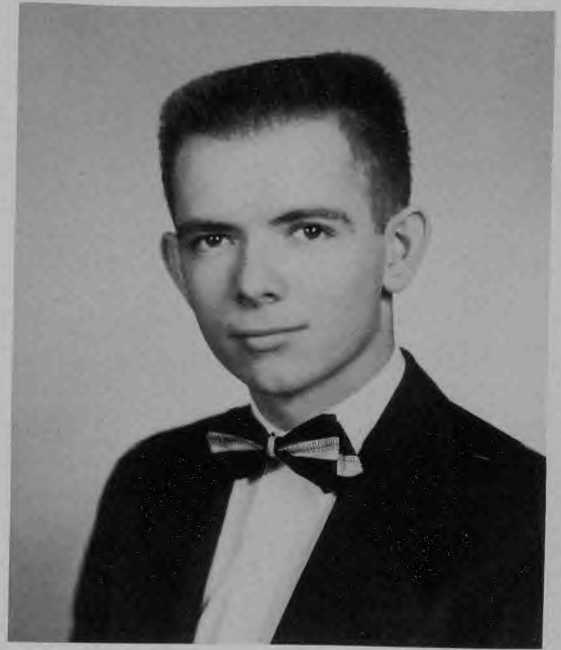

The "Preps" will lose only two players from this year's team due to graduation: Errol Porter and Harry Rust.

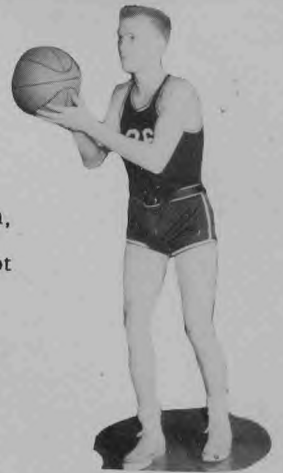
We are proud of our team and hope they continue to show their fighting spirit and good sportsmanship in the future.

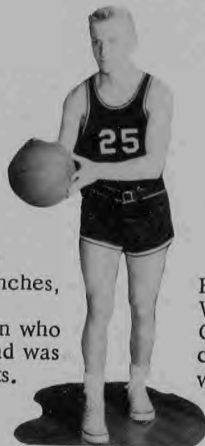
